FROM FR. SEAN:

Two years ago, when I was temporary pastor of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel Parish, a woman who was in remission from breast cancer came to see me and told me of her comforting experience with a simple Prayer Blanket that was given to her by a member of her church. She said that praying and holding the blanket before and after surgery and especially while getting chemotherapy, she "felt covered in prayer" and that almost immediately she "sensed the spiritual and loving presence of God and of her fellow parishioners".

I'm happy to say that our Religious Education Program is beginning a new ministry for our church - The Ministry of Prayer Blankets. These blankets are meant to bring comfort for those who are suffering a chronic illness, may be facing spiritual conflicts, grieving a loved one or any other physical or mental health issues, stress, bereavement, or any life problem.

Eighth grade volunteers will meet in a spirit of prayer and community and make these simple no sew fleece tie blankets. Blankets are given to people who need our support in any way. There is no cost, or limit on who may request a blanket. People of any denomination may request a blanket. Those who are sick, grieving the loss of a loved one, recovering from an operation, or distressed, depressed, whatever the need, and regardless of church affiliation.

As a means to further involve our youngsters, as well as you, our parishioners, in this ministry, they will also accept the responsibility of financing this Prayer Blanket Ministry by holding bake sales between our weekend masses (please see another blurb in the bulletin). All funds raised will be for the Prayer Blanket Ministry. You will also be invited to participate in this ministry by praying over the blankets at our Masses. Prayer blankets comfort the sick and give all of us a concrete and enjoyable way to join in an act of charity and solidarity. Please pray for the success of our Prayer Blanket Ministry.
