The Easter readings focus on the goodness, power and saving work of God throughout history. And the themes of Easter weave together to form the rich tapestry of Easter's significance:

- Resurrection: The cornerstone of Easter celebrates Jesus' victory over death and symbolizes hope and the promise of eternal life.
- **Renewal and Rebirth**: Easter is a time of new beginnings and spiritual renewal.
- **Redemption**: Jesus' sacrifice on the cross highlights the theme of redemption and the forgiveness of sins for humanity.
- **Faith and Belief**: Easter is a call to deepen one's faith and trust in the power of God.
- Joy and Celebration: Easter is a time of celebration, characterized by joyous liturgies, music and the proclamation of the "Alleluia."
- **Community and Unity**: Easter brings together the Christian community in worship and celebration, emphasizing unity in Christ.
- Transformation and Conversion: Easter encourages believers to turn away from sin and embrace a life transformed by God's grace.
- Divine Mercy: This theme focuses on God's infinite mercy and love, inviting believers to trust in his message of mercy and to act mercifully toward others.

A COMFORTABLE LENTEN PROGRAM

For the first five Sundays of Lent right after the 10 o'clock Mass, parishioners were invited into the hall to reflect on and discuss the day's Gospel reading.

Written feedback from participants about the hourlong session, led by Deacon Carl and fueled with snacks, was very positive.

The program's flexibility was praised. There was no pressure either to commit to attending every session or even to talk. Listening was still participating. Yet, those who did share appreciated the thought-provoking questions and the small



groups, which gave everyone the ability to grow spiritually in a safe and comfortable setting. There were no wrong answers. There was no judgment. And the ability to move from table to table was applauded, increasing the opportunities to hear different perspectives and gain additional insights.

Participants felt they not only had a better understanding of those Gospels, but of one another and themselves. The consensus was that programs structured such as this, to enrich faith and foster community, should be a mainstay at St. Paul's. And based on this response, it is hoped that there will be more programs in the near future.

"We are all in this together, and without discussion and socialization, our faith will not grow," read one thoughtful response.
