

Reading II: Colossians 3: 1-4

The promises of the Messianic age are fulfilled in Jesus Christ. At the end of time, Christ and all the believers in Him will appear in glory.

The Gospel: John 20: 1-9

In John's Gospel, written the last of the four, the full meaning of Easter is the completion of Jesus' return to His Father. Only then will the disciples "remember" and understand the meaning of these events. Meanwhile, "the Beloved Disciple" immediately believes in the resurrection, as opposed to the doubt of Thomas.

AN INTERVIEW WITH AN APOSTLE

Jehudi: But what about all the rumors circulating in the city this morning that your Jesus has risen and has been seen by several of His female followers?

You: Well, at the risk of being labeled a misogynist, I know how women can be overly emotional at times, and get carried away by their wishful thinking. I will admit that our leader and our youngest did go to the Master's tomb and confirmed the women's report.

Jehudi: Our sources tell us that procurator Pilate is angry over the lax behavior of the guards he posted at the tomb, and High Priest Caiaphas has scheduled an audience with Pilate to request quick action on this.

You: On those items I have no comment. If you'll excuse me, it is time for our evening prayer.

Jehudi: Thank you. We await further developments. This is Jehudi Ben Achaz, JMJ News, Jerusalem.

I used to ask my high-schoolers what was the most important feast day, and inevitably they would answer "Christmas." Easy to understand when you consider the hullabaloo with which the secular world surrounds December 25th. But Christmas is primarily meaningful in the light of Easter. It marks the birth of God made man. In fact, the four Gospels were written well after the Resurrection. That immediately offers us the lens through which to view the words and deeds of Jesus in His earthly life, which they record.

Yes, He is risen! Our Faith has a basis; our Hope a fulfillment; and our Love a motivation. The dream of eternal union with God is possible. It is the day the Lord has made. Let us rejoice in it and be glad!


