### THIS WEEKEND'S READINGS

FOCUS: God's wisdom guides us to love in truth.

Human wisdom, hard as it is to come by, differs qualitatively from the wisdom of God. God's wisdom draws not only on God's knowledge of all things, but also on God's love of all things in totality and purity. When we follow Christ, we are drawn deeper into his way of love. We seek and trust his wisdom as the way of life.

#### LITURGY OF THE WORD:

In the first reading, Sirach tells the people that if they choose to follow the commandments, they will be saved: Before man are life and death, good and evil. Saint Paul writes of



God's wisdom, whose depth and mystery is beyond understanding. In the Gospel, Jesus proclaims his mission to fulfill the law and the prophets and calls for following the law of God in a new way, with totality of heart.
