THIS WEEKEND'S READINGS

First: 1 Samuel 26:2, 7-9. 12-13, 22-23

Second: 1 Corinthians 15:45-49

Gospel: Luke 6:27-38

FOCUS: We are called to bear Christ's merciful image.

The Lord delivers Saul into David's hands, and yet David chooses not to kill but to show mercy. As followers of Christ, we are called to love even our enemies and treat them as we would want them to treat us. We are asked to ignore our natural inclinations toward revenge and recompense, and instead choose forgiveness and generosity – to conform ourselves to Christ.

LITURGY OF THE WORD: Even though Saul is

delivered into his hands by the Lord, David chooses not to kill him. Paul writes that just as we have borne the image of Adam, we shall also bear the image of Christ. Jesus tells his



disciples to love their enemies, give to everyone who asks, and be merciful as the Father is merciful.

VOCATION

It is true that the difficulties they experience in their own family can lead many young people to ask whether it is worthwhile to start a new family, to be faithful, to be generous. I can tell you that it certainly is. It is worth your every effort to invest in the family; there you will find the best incentives to mature and the greatest joys to experience and share. Don't let yourselves be robbed of a great love. Don't let yourselves be led astray by those who propose a life of rampant individualism that in the end leads to isolation and the worst sort of loneliness.

If we are indeed convinced that the Holy Spirit continues to inspire vocations to the priesthood and the religious life, we can "once more cast out the nets" in the Lord's name, with complete confidence. We can dare, as we should, to tell each young person to ask whether this is the path that they are meant to follow.



UNDERSTANDING THE SYNOD

Pope Francis has called the universal Church to Synod, 2021-2023: "Communion, Participation and Mission."

What is a synod? Simply put, a synod is a meeting or assembly of church leaders. "Synodality" refers to the way that these synods make decisions. It is a model that includes listening to a broad range of people and then discussing the issues with the goal of hearing where the Holy Spirit is calling the church.

Pope Francis has said this means not entering the discussion with the idea that there will be "winners" who get their way and "losers" who do not, but leaving agendas at the door, speaking with parrhesia (a Greek word that appears in the New Testament and means "frankness," "boldness" or "courage"), listening humbly and being open to others' ideas.

In theory, no topic is off-limits, and disagreement is welcome. After the discussions, the bishops of the synod draft a document and vote, paragraph by paragraph, to approve it. The pope uses that document to inform his decisions following the synod.
