## THIS WEEKEND'S READINGS

First Reading – Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7 Second Reading – Acts 10:34-38 Gospel – Luke 3:15-16, 21-22

Focus: God seeks out the sinner and loves us unconditionally.

Today's feast is another "epiphany" – a revelation of who Jesus is. By submitting himself to John's baptism, a baptism of repentance, Jesus, who is sinless, draws near to sinners and joins himself with them. The voice of the Father saying, "You are my beloved Son; with you I am well pleased" consoles us because we who are joined to Christ in baptism are made beloved children of the Father. These truths reveal God's goodness and his unconditional love for us.

#### Liturgy of the Word:

In today's first reading, the prophet Isaiah declares that God's servant will be a light for the nations and will bring forth justice for all. Peter, in the second reading, declares that God anointed Jesus with the



Holy Spirit and power. In the Gospel, John announces one mightier than himself is coming and baptizes Jesus. When Jesus is baptized, the Holy Spirit descends upon him.








## TAKE THE BUS TO THE ARK
