THIS WEEKEND'S READINGS

First: Deuteronomy 18:15-20 Second: 1 Corinthians 7:32-35 Gospel: Mark 1:21-28 FOCUS: Jesus taught as one having authority – having power of his own.

When Jesus speaks or teaches, his words have power; for example, in today's Gospel by driving out demons. In our lives, Jesus can free us from anxiety and bring us into union with the Father in the kingdom to come. Unlike all the preceding prophets, Jesus does not simply convey God's word and commands. He *is* God's word in the flesh. His power derives from the Father, for he and the Father are one.

LITURGY OF THE WORD:

In the first reading, Moses says God will raise up a new prophet who will speak the words of God. In the second reading, Paul contrasts the divided loyalties of married people



with those who are unmarried and have only the desire to please the Lord. In the Gospel, Jesus commands an unclean spirit to be quiet and come out of a man in the synagogue.




