Lord, open my heart to see those who need my care. Teach me to love without hesitation or judgment. Help me to live your word through simple acts of kindness and mercy. May I become a neighbor to everyone I meet. Amen.

In the Gospel story of the Good Samaritan for the 15th Sunday in Ordinary Time Year C, Jesus uses the example of a Samaritan to show what it means to follow God's will. Samaritans were seen as outsiders who did not keep the law as did the Jewish people. Yet, in the parable, the Samaritan does what others do not do: He stops to care for someone who is suffering.

The priest and Levite, who should have known the law best, ignore the man in need. They may have been concerned about purity rules or their own safety. However, the Samaritan, though rejected by others, does not ask who the injured man is nor does he question whether he deserves help. He simply chooses to care for him, thereby living out God's call to love.

It is interesting that Jesus chooses a Samaritan as the parable's hero because Jesus himself had been turned away by a Samaritan village. But Jesus does not hold a grudge. Instead, he uses one of them as an example of love and mercy.
