# THIS WEEKEND'S READINGS

First: Amos 7:12-15 Second: Ephesians 1:3-14

(shorter form Ephesians 1:3-10)

Gospel: Mark 6:7-13

FOCUS: God sends us on mission and provides us with the riches of his grace.

We hear in the second reading that God has lavished the riches of his grace upon us. He calls us, and he accompanies us in that call. God will ask much of us, but let us not be afraid, for God's call is an invitation to live fully, richly and generously.

#### LITURGY OF THE WORD:

In the first reading, Amos is called a prophet by a priest of Bethel. He responds that God took him from following the flock as a shepherd and sent him to prophesy. In the epistle,



Paul writes that we are chosen and that God has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing. In the Gospel, Jesus sends the Twelve out two by two and instructs them to take nothing for their journey.

11:30 a.m. – Feast Day Mass to be celebrated by Bishop Edward B. Scharfenberger, DD, of Albany.


Mass will be followed by a procession and outdoor crowning at the Mount Carmel Shrine.
