THIS WEEKEND'S READINGS

First: Exodus 24:3-8 (Corpus Christi) Second: Hebrews 9:11-15 - SOLEMNITY Gospel: Mark 14:12-16, 22-26 FOCUS: Jesus' sacrifice seals our covenant with God forever.

As we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ, we give thanks in a particular way for Christ's perfect offering of himself as the eternal sacrifice. In ancient times, sacrifices of animals, material goods or even humans were offered to divine entities. These were ritual ceremonies forced upon the people as an act of worship or placation. Jesus, in revealing to all the one true God, offers his own body and blood for our salvation. This perfect sacrifice has united us to the Father once more and is the source and summit of our life in Christ.

LITURGY OF THE WORD:

In the first reading, Moses and the people offer sacrifices to God. The author of the second reading emphasizes that Christ sacrificed his own blood, an offering far greater



than an animal. In the Gospel, Jesus sends his disciples to prepare for Passover. While they were eating, Jesus blessed bread and wine and gave it to his disciples, saying, this is my body, and this is my blood of the covenant.

CORPUS CHRISTI CONNECTION

Last week, on May 23 – just days prior to the 700th Anniversary of the Solemnity of The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ (Corpus Christi) – Pope Francis

recognized a second miracle attributed to Blessed Carlo Acutis, paving the way toward his becoming the first "millennial saint."

Carlo, born in 1991, was an Italian teen who loved soccer, Nutella, volunteering and computers. Because of his passion for technology, coupled with his deep Catholic faith, he spent four



years creating a website that cataloged the worldwide locations of Church-recognized Eucharistic miracles. He called the Eucharist the "Highway to Heaven."

Carlo completed this compilation of photographs and historical descriptions in 2005 – a year before his death from leukemia.

A Eucharistic miracle is one wherein the Eucharist takes on the biological qualities of human flesh or blood or both. (Interestingly, some research indicates that the blood type connected to Eucharistic miracles has been AB – and the blood on the Shroud of Turin tested AB negative). Carlo recorded 187 such miracles – including the one from 1263 that led Pope Urban IV to officially institute in August of 1264 the annual celebration of the Solemnity of Corpus Christi.

One year earlier, in 1263 during a pilgrimage to Rome, a German priest, who found it difficult to believe that Christ was actually present in the consecrated host, celebrated Mass in the church above the tomb of St. Christina in Bolsena.

It is said that he had barely spoken the words of consecration when blood started to seep from the host over his hands, onto the altar and the corporal (a linen cloth on the altar used to catch any crumbs from the host). The priest asked to be taken to Pope Urban., who resided in the neighboring town of Orvieto. The pope dispatched emissaries to investigate.

This relic (the Corporal of Bosena) was brought to and is preserved in the Orvieto Cathedral. Every year on the Feast of The Most Holy Body and Blood of Christi, which is considered a major public holiday in Orvieto, there is a procession through the city with the relic.
