#### THIS WEEKEND'S READINGS

First: Samuel 16:1b, 6-7, 10-13a Second: Ephesians 5:8-14 Gospel: John 9:1-41 FOCUS: Live as children of light, for light produces every kind of goodness.

Sometimes doing God's will can seem strange, foolish or even wrong to others. Jesse assumed his youngest son couldn't be the next king, so David was left to care for the sheep when Samuel came. The Pharisees thought Jesus sinned by healing on the sabbath. Are we preoccupied with what others will think, or are we focused on doing God's will?

#### LITURGY OF THE WORD:

God sends Samuel to anoint the new king of Israel. Samuel surprises everyone by calling for and anointing David, the youngest of Jesse's sons.



The Lord's Spirit rushed upon David. Saint Paul tells the Ephesians to live as children of light and expose darkness. In the Gospel, Jesus heals a blind man on the sabbath, breaking the sabbath rules.

## A RECAP OF LAST WEEKEND

First Eucharist Retreat on Saturday



At the three-hour **First Eucharist Retreat**, 10 youngsters got a hands-on lesson in breadmaking from Mr. Rick (Dzurilla) – who said the kids really loved it – especially making the sticky mess while combining the ingredients! They had to patiently wait as the bread rose enough to knead again, with the most-asked question of catechist Erinn Sansalone, her assistant Megan Maragliano and Jessica Carpino, the program's coordinator: "Can we eat our bread now?"

They also made the banners that will hang from their pews and learned a song to perform for their families on the day they make their First Holy Communion.

The children were engaged, too, by Tony Bellizzi, guest inspirational speaker and youth minister, who taught them his famous mantra: "God is good, all the time! All the time, God is good!"

And they left with warm bread in their hands, enriched by its symbolism – and finally ready to eat!

#### **AFF Presentation on Sunday**

Fourteen people attended the Sunday-after-Mass presentation on **Spiritual Direction** and the **Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius** sponsored by the Adult Faith Formation Committee.

Spiritual Direction has long been available to lay people in the Church. It entails an individual meeting monthly with a trained Spiritual Director who listens and sheds light on the presence of God in the individual's life. The desire is to build a deeper and more intimate relationship with God under the guidance of the Holy Spirit.

The Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius have been around for nearly 500 years, but only since Vatican II have they been adapted so that lay people could participate without going away on a 30-day retreat. The Exercises involve meeting weekly with a trained director, praying through meditation and Scripture for an hour a day for 32 weeks. The focus initially is on God's unconditional love for us.

Several attendees were already familiar with Spiritual Direction and had seen or were currently seeing a Spiritual Director. Another parishioner had recently completed the Exercises and shared how she experienced the grace of feeling God's closeness. Thoughtful questions and enlightening discussion were also part of the hour presentation.
