THIS WEEKEND'S READINGS

First: Ezekiel 18:25-28

Second: Philippians 2:1-11 or 2:1-5

Gospel: Matthew 21:28-32

FOCUS: Turn away from sin and follow Christ.

In today's Gospel parable, there is a model son, who gives honor to his father by verbally assenting to his father's wishes. But his words are hollow, and his virtue is a mirage. How does our own reality measure up to our Christian ideals? Loving our neighbor sounds like a lovely sentiment until someone cuts us off on the highway. May Christ who calls us always to conversion help us root out any hollowness and hypocrisy in our own lives that we may truly confess that Jesus is Lord.

LITURGY OF THE WORD:

Today's readings are tied together by the theme of conversion. Ezekiel assures that those who turn away from sin shall not die. The Letter to the Philippians encourages



unity in turning away from selfishness to emulate Christ. And Jesus' parable favors the son who shamefully indicated defiance, but changed his mind and was obedient.
