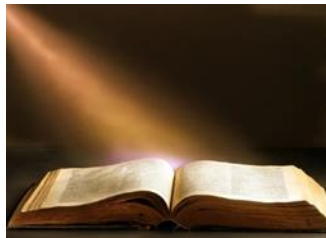
THIS WEEKEND'S READINGS

First: Exodus 17:8-13
Second: 2 Timothy 3:14-4:2
Gospel: Luke 18:1-8
FOCUS: *Persist in prayer.*

Prayer comes easily in times of need. But how often do we breathe in the silence and communicate with God – to hear his word, to know his will, to find true peace? Let us persist in our prayer to God, who made all things and keeps them in existence.

LITURGY OF THE WORD:

In the first reading, a fatigued Moses keeps his hands raised – with the assistance of Aaron and Hur – so that the Israelites can conquer the Amalekites. St. Paul encourages Timothy to be faithful to what he has learned and believed. In the Gospel, Jesus tells the disciples a parable about the necessity to pray always without becoming weary.

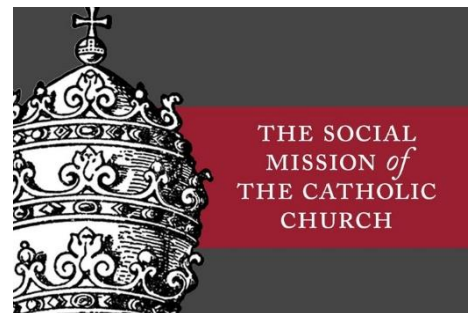
