First Reading - Isaiah 50:5-9a

The suffering servant of Yahweh is assured of God's help.

Second Reading - James 2:14-18

James teaches that faith must be demonstrated in one's works.

Gospel Reading - Mark 8:27-35

Peter declares that Jesus is the Christ, and Jesus teaches that those who would follow him must take up his or her cross.

Focus: Our lives must demonstrate our belief in Christ.


Today we hear the question that is at the center of the entire Gospel: Who is Jesus, and what does it mean to follow him? We would do well to reflect on this question from time to time. Who do we say that Jesus is, and how do our actions demonstrate this belief? Liturgy of the Word:


Isaiah prophesies of the servant of the Lord who has not turned his back on the Lord but has given his back to those who beat him, believing that the Lord is his help. In the second reading, James argues that faith without works is dead. In the Gospel, Jesus asks his disciples who they say he is. Peter answers, "You are the Christ." Jesus then says that anyone who wishes to follow him must take up his cross.

At those monthly meetings, ministry reports are first given. There are also discussions about what's going on, what's needed and what can be improved. The Parish Council serves as an advisory committee to Fr. Sean, offering fresh ideas and perspectives.

Now is the time to think about who you'd like to nominate for the three seats that need to be filled in January of 2025. A term is three years with the option to run for a second three-year term.

Nomination forms are in the church vestibules and need to be returned to the office by Monday, September 30.

BEREAVEMENT PROGAM SCHEDULED

There is no time limit in grief. There is no fast track to feeling better. And the life-changing loss of a loved one is not something to "get over."

Rather, while grief is universal, it is at the same time a journey with a timeline as unique as the individual experiencing it.

At 9 a.m. Saturday, October 26, the six-week Bereavement Program will again take place at St. Paul's for those who did not attend last year. Julie Laurenzi, Liz Locatelli and Kate Gallaher Carson, who have completed the Archdiocese's training, will lead the sessions designed to support the bereaved as they continue on their own healing path. It is open to those struggling with the loss of a loved one – regardless of when that passing occurred.

Thereafter, the group will continue to meet from 9-10:30 Saturday mornings through December 7, with the exception of Saturday, November 2, which is the date of the annual **Memorial Mass** to honor deceased relatives and friends. (See below.)

Chris Worthington and Deb Harrison, our youth ministers, have launched a new venture: The SPYM Family Devotional Series! Here's what they do:


