Gospel Reading

Mark 9:38-43,45,47-48

Jesus teaches that whoever is not against him is for him.

Focus: "Whatever causes you to sin, get rid of it."

This phrase is really the talking point of Jesus' message in today's Gospel, and it's fairly straightforward. If something in our life is leading us into sin, and away from God, that something needs to be jettisoned like the dead weight that it is. We heed similar advice from mentors and coaches looking to improve our performance. How much more valuable are these words from the Lord, who desires to improve our life, and for us to share it with him forever?

Liturgy of the Word:

In the first reading, the spirit of the Lord is bestowed upon Moses and the 70 elders, and Moses wishes that the spirit would be bestowed on all people. In the epistle, James gives a warning to the rich, describing the miseries that will befall them because of their exploitation and oppression of the poor. In the Gospel, Jesus points out that "Whoever is not against us is for us." He cautions against anyone who would cause a little one to sin and instructs his listeners to remove from themselves whatever leads to sin.
