THIS WEEKEND'S READINGS

First: Jeremiah 20:7-9
Second: Romans 12:1-2
Gospel: Matthew 16:21-27
FOCUS: Take up [your] cross and follow me.

Jesus began to explain to his disciples that he would have to suffer, die and be raised on the third day. The disciples did not immediately understand, but we know that those who wish to follow Jesus into eternal life must take up their cross as well. For whoever loses their life for Jesus' sake will find it.

LITURGY OF THE WORD:

In the first reading, Jeremiah bemoans the suffering he endures because of his faithfulness to the word of the Lord. In the reading from Romans, we are urged to offer



our bodies as a living sacrifice and be transformed. In the Gospel, Jesus urges his disciples to take up their cross and follow him.


