THIS WEEKEND'S READINGS

First reading – Ezekiel 33:7-9

I appoint you as watchman for the house of Israel. If you fail to warn the wicked and they die in guilt, you're responsible. If you warn them and they don't turn, they die, but you're saved.

Second reading – Romans 13:8-10

Owing love to one another fulfills the law. The commandments are summarized by loving your neighbor as yourself, for love does no evil and is the complete fulfillment of the law.

Gospel - Matthew 18:15-20

If a brother sins, discuss it privately, then with witnesses if needed, and finally with the church. What is agreed on earth reflects in heaven, and where people gather in Jesus' name, he is present.

Focus: God's loving presence is with us always.

God is with us, intimately close, just as Jesus was to the man in the Gospel today. In the Mass, Jesus reaches out to touch us and offer his healing. May we always be granted an open heart and clear vision to see his loving presence among us.

Liturgy of the Word:

In the first reading, the prophet Isaiah speaks for the Lord, saying to the frightened, "Be strong and fear not!" In the Letter from Saint James, we are encouraged to show no partiality because God chose the poor in the world to be heirs of the kingdom. In the Gospel, Jesus heals a deaf man with a speech impediment and all are exceedingly astonished.


